# CLASS OUT, HAT ON!

Students are in school when daily ultraviolet (UV) radiation levels are at their peak. In order to meet our duty of care, we require students and teachers to wear a hat during Terms I and 4 whenever they are outside, and when the UV measures 3 or above during other terms. In SA, the reality is daily UV is typically 3 and above from August to the end of April and so it is imperative that your child has a suitable hat at school, as per our <u>Hat Guidelines</u>:

- A broad-brimmed bucket hat the school hat is preferred and can be purchased from the Front Office; other wide-brim hats are not permitted.
- Caps are not acceptable.
- Students without a sun protective hat are provided with a spare hat to engage in learning programs outside, only (eg for a PE lesson, not for recess/lunch breaks).
- Students without an appropriate hat will be asked to use shaded areas or suitable areas protected from the sun.
- Hats are to be removed when inside.

We appreciate your support in the implementation of the Hat Guidelines and in providing your child with a hat in line with requirements.

DROP-OFF AND PICK-UP
To ensure the safety of all children,

please adhere to speed limits and road rules on site; and only drop-off and pick-up students from the 'bus' or Kindy car parks.

SCHOOL SUPERVISION HOURS While we are thrilled with the enthusiasm to be at school early, please be aware that school grounds are supervised from 8.30am in the morning until 3.30pm. Outside of these times, the duty of care for sits with parent/caregiver. To ensure your child's safety, please ensure your child arrives on school grounds from 8.35am and leaves promptly after the bell. lt İS helpful parents/caregivers of R-2 students collect their child directly from their classroom.

# WHAT IS SCHOOL CARD?



School Card provides financial help to cover the cost of school fees.

# WHO CAN APPLY?

To qualify for School Card, your family's income must be below a specific limit. This limit depends on how many children are in your care.

You must **also** meet at least one of the following:

- have a child or children aged four years or over who attend a school full time
- be an independent full-time student studying year 10, 11 or 12
- be an adult re-entry student undertaking subjects to complete SACE (years 11 and 12).

After you apply, you will receive a letter in the mail advising if your application has been approved. Please note, School Card is not a student identification card.
