#### Gift of life for BCS:

Burra Community School received a new defibrillator machine on Thursday, March 14, following a generous donation from the Burra Country Music Events (BCME).

The defibrillator, valued at \$1800 was purchased from the Australian Medical Association for the annual Burra Country Music Festival. The festival attracted thousands of people to the town, however, due to the COVID-19 pandemic the event was forced to cancel.

BCME committee wished to see the potentially life-saving equipment go to a local club or group, and learning the school was yet to obtain one, the decision was unanimous.

Festival Music Director, Tracey Rains said acts of kindness and generosity have far reaching effects, strengthening relationships, and creating a more supportive and inclusive society.

"As a committee we have experienced this from wonderful years of volunteering with a small, but mighty group of people. Being able to give this valuable piece of equipment to the school is an honour and privilege; hopefully it is never needed, but if the need arises, it's nice to know we were able to assist in helping someone."

As a community hub, the school facilities are enjoyed by many groups and organisations including the Burra Basketball Association, BBH Netball and Football Clubs,

patrons of the Swimming Pool, and visitors to the school and library. Principal Briony Ackland said, "We are grateful for the generosity of the Burra Country Music Events as it will not only be a valuable resource for the school but also the wider community who make great use of our shared facilities - from users of the community library or swimming pool, to those at the school and ELC, or gymnasium also hired by many a local sporting group, the defibrillator will be readily accessible should the need ever arise."

#### **AQUATICS CAMP**



Briannah - My favourite part of camp was face planting into the water so hard and also Jett singing songs while we took photos










#### What is the Autism Inclusion Teacher role?

Dear Parents and Carers

For those of you new to Burra Community School, my name is Bridget Ross and I am the Autism Inclusion Teacher (AIT) for Burra Community School. Autism Inclusion Teachers are given time each week in their AIT roles to focus on strengthening our school community's inclusion of students on the autism spectrum. The Department for Education provides an Autism Inclusion Multidisciplinary (AIM) team to support them in the AIT roles. The team includes, senior advisor educators, developmental educator, psychologist, occupational therapist, speech pathologist and an Aboriginal cultural project officer. The information from the AIM team is evidence-based and informed by the autistic and autism community.

The role as an AIT is to pass on information, resources and training they receive from the AIM team to other staff and parents.

If you have any questions, want to chat, or need some information; please ring the office to make an appointment with me. I am available in my role every Thursday afternoon, however feel free to contact me for a time that suits.
