

During Terms 1 & 2 Senior Agriculture students have been working with the Steers, Sheep and Goats to break them in and prepare the animals for the Royal Adelaide Show.



Tegan, Abbie, Jasmin, Sophie and Evelyn have been working with 3 steers, Rusty (South Devon), Teddy (Speckle Park) and Humphry (Murray Grey).

They have been busy leading them along the bike track and practicing their ring work, handling and washing skills.

This term they will be preparing the steers for the show by feeding them while tied up, drinking out of buckets, conditioning and trimming their coat.

Nick, Ashley, Jade, Dustin, Jaxson and Emmylou have been working with the sheep and preparing them by leading them around the ag block and bike track.

They are also trying to expose them to different environments to get them used to their handlers in higher stress situations.

These students have also been practicing some of their sheep judging skills, and will further develop these at the Jamestown Education day on Monday.





Anna, Annabelle, Breanna, Kaidance, Lachie, Gus, Sophie and Abbie, have been working with the goats and training them to walk on a lead.

The drivers and road crew were very supportive of this and we are grateful for the opportunity.




Once again "The Burra Market" has generously donated \$700 towards Canberra. Their continuous support of our students is very appreciated!!!!
